FOXBORO Friendship Group – From 401 and Hwy 62, go north on 62 to Foxboro exit (Ashley St.). Turn RIGHT and go EAST on Ashley (it will bend and end up going NORTH) to Emmanuel United Church at 458 Ashley St.

BEAVER LAKE Group – Go north on HWY 41 from 401 to County Road 4. Turn RIGHT and go EAST to Tamworth. Turn RIGHT and go SOUTH to 6668 Wheeler St. (Tamworth Elementary School) and the EAST side.

TWEED 12 Step Meeting Group – Go NORTH on Hwy 37 from 401 to Tweed. St. Andrews Presbyterian Church is on the RIGHT side, across from Valu-Mart.

THE 41 Group & THE 41 TWELVE STEP DISCUSSION Meeting – Go NORTH on Hwy 41 from 401 to Cloyne (NORTH of HWY 7). Barrie Township Hall is on the EAST (Right) side.

ENTERPRISE 12 Step Group – Go NORTH on Hwy 41 from 401 to Croydon Road (CR #14) turn EAST / RIGHT. Travel 15.2 km. To School Rd. (just before the yellow flashing light in Enterprise) turn LEFT/ NORTH. Go approx. .2 kms. On the LEFT, entrance through doors at the north parking lot.

MARYSVILLE 12 & 12 Group – Take Hwy 49 south from 401. Turn RIGHT and go EAST on HWY 2 approximately 3 km to 7274 (Church Hall)

PICTON 12 & 12 Meeting – Take Hwy 49 SOUTH from 401 to Picton. The meeting is just inside town limit at 403 Main Street Prince Edward County Hospital.

STIRLING FRIDAY NIGHT Group – Take Hwy 62 NORTH from 401 to County Road 8 (Ridge Road). Turn LEFT and go WEST to Stirling. Meeting is at United Church at the corner of Mill and Edward Streets.

STIRLING 12 STEP Meeting – need new direction ... please send to webmaster.

LENNOX Group and NAPANEE BIG BOOK Group – Take Hwy 41 SOUTH from 401 to Napanee. Turn LEFT and Bridge Street East and go EAST (first set of lights north of Hwy 2)

CANNIFTON FRIDAY NIGHT Group – Take Hwy 37 north from 401 to County Road 6 (Cannifton Road) to St. Marks United Church.

SKYWAY Group – Take Hwy 49 SOUTH from 401. Turn LEFT and go EAST on Hwy 2 to Deseronto. Turn RIGHT and go SOUTH on Fourth Street to Thomas Street. United Church is on the north-east corner.

MAZINAW 12 & 12 Group– Take Hwy 41 NORTH from 401 to Hwy 7. Turn RIGHT (EAST). The Community Centre is on your LEFT (NORTH side).

VERONA Meeting – Hwy 38 NORTH from 401 to Verona. Mom's Restaurant is on your left (WEST side)

WELLINGTON BIG BOOK Group – Hwy 62 SOUTH from Bay Bridge to Union Road. Turn RIGHT and go to County Road 2 (1/2 km). Turn right and follow 2 to HWY 33 (16 km). Turn RIGHT and go ½ km to United Church.

QUNITE Group & Big Book Meeting (Held upstairs) Hwy. 401 to Hwy. 37 South (Cannifton Road) turn LEFT on Station Street, then turn RIGHT on Herchimer, South to Bridge (Corner of Bridge & Herchimer)

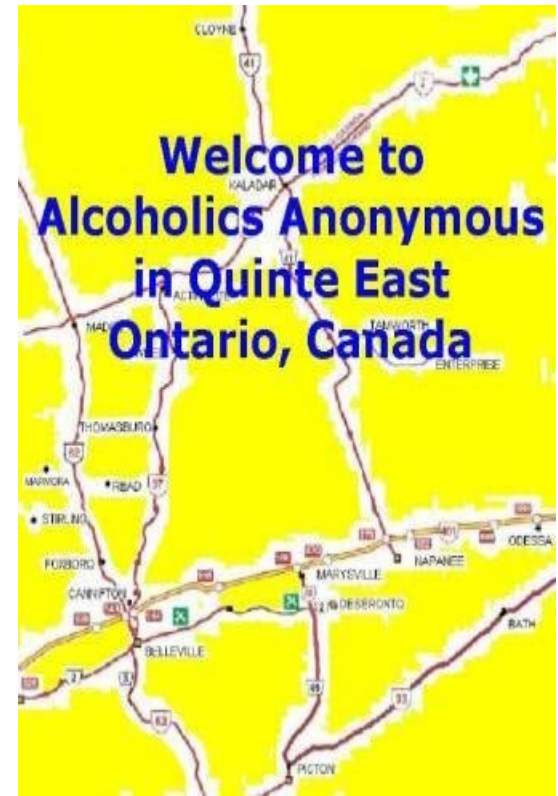
Happy Destiny Group- From the North travel South on Hwy. 62 (North Front St. & Pinnacle St.) to Hwy. 2 (Dundas St.) turn LEFT, travel approx. 500 yards through first set of stop lights. Turn RIGHT at the Police Station onto George St. Follow to St. Paul parking lot to Foster Ward Community Centre, on the corner of George & St. Paul Streets.

Moira Group- Take Hwy. 2 (Dundas St.) to hospital east end of town to Macdonald St. traffic lights then turn South to parking. Enter revolving doors turn right and go downstairs, then turn right down the corridor and the room is on the right.

Picton New Life Group- When coming from Hwy. 62 take Hwy. 33 through Bloomfield into Picton, Pass No Frills to Masonic Lodge on your Right.

Mohawk Unity Group & Women Living Sober- Go South on Hwy. 37 continue onto Cannifton Rd. Turn LEFT onto Station St. Turn RIGHT onto Herchimer Ave. Then turn LEFT onto Bridge St. 520 Bridge St.

As Bill Sees It - From Picton drive 6 km West along Hwy. 33 (Loyalist Pkwy) to Bloomfield. Use church entrance off parking lot.
